






Welcome to St Margaret's Hospice.








We care for people over the age of 18.

At St Margaret's Hospice we will care for you.




This may be in the hospice building in Taunton or Yeovil

We are here to support you.




We want to know what is important to you

Please tell someone if you are feeling more tired than usual.



Please tell someone if you are sick or feel sick.



Please tell someone if you have any problems with going to the toilet.



Please tell someone if you don't feel hungry.






Please tell doctors and nurses if you have any problems that are bothering you.

It is ok to feel sad or upset.




Try talking to someone you trust. It helps to talk.

You might feel like nobody understands.




We have people who you can talk to.




It can be hard to talk about dying. We have people who can support you and discuss what is important to you.




If you want to think about your funeral, please talk to us.
